Purposes of the Local Communities and Indigenous Peoples Platform

"To strengthen the knowledge, technologies, practices and efforts of local communities and indigenous peoples related to addressing and responding to climate change, to facilitate the exchange of experience and the sharing of best practices and lessons learned related to mitigation and adaptation in a holistic and integrated manner and to enhance the engagement of local communities and indigenous peoples in the UNFCCC process"

Introduction to the proposed two-year workplan

Context and background

The Facilitative Working Group (FWG) of the Local Communities and Indigenous Peoples Platform (LCIPP) presents the draft two-year work plan of the Platform. The FWG developed this workplan in accordance with the Paris Agreement, in decision 1/CP.21, to take collective action "to mobilize stronger and more ambitious climate action by all," including Indigenous peoples and local communities.

The Facilitative Working Group recognizes the significance of the decision made by the Conference of the Parties at its twenty-first session to establish "a platform for the exchange of experiences and sharing of best practices on mitigation and adaptation in a holistic and integrated manner" for indigenous peoples, local communities and Parties. It also noted decision 2/CP.23 and decision 2/CP.24 in its development of the proposed workplan.

Overarching outcomes

The Facilitative Working Group underscores its determination to operationalize the Platform's activities in order to strengthen:

- (a) The knowledge, technologies, practices and efforts of local communities and indigenous peoples related to addressing and responding to climate change at the local, national, regional and international levels.
- (b) The capacity of Indigenous peoples, local communities and Parties to reach the Paris Agreement temperature goal, including through policies and actions based on traditional knowledge, the knowledge of Indigenous Peoples, and local knowledge systems, Indigenous values and practices, and enhanced stewardship;
- (c) The engagement, inclusion, and partnership of indigenous peoples and local communities, including women, youth and knowledge holders, in the UNFCCC and other processes in a manner that recognizes traditional knowledge, the knowledge of indigenous peoples, and local knowledge systems as well as the practices and contributions of indigenous peoples and local communities.
- (d) The understanding, respect, transmission and safeguarding of traditional knowledge, the knowledge of Indigenous peoples (and the associated rights) and local knowledge systems.

In accordance with decision 2/CP.24, direct involvement of Indigenous peoples and Parties has successfully led to the development of this flexible workplan under the incremental approach to operationalize the Platform. The workplan groups its activities according to the specific functions noted in decision 2/CP.23, broadly referred to as: knowledge; capacity for engagement; and climate change policies and actions. Furthermore, while activities are grouped by function, the workplan includes many activities that are cross-cutting, with the intention to advance more than one function with each activity. The activities are also intended to have multi-level impacts at the local/tribal/community, national, regional and international levels. Consistent with its mandate outlined in decision 2/CP.24, the Facilitative Working Group will strive to conduct these activities in collaboration with other bodies under and outside the Convention to enhance the Platform's coherence and impact. The activities of the Platform will mainstream gender considerations in coherence with the gender Action plan of the UNFCCC.

Knowledge

The platform promotes the exchange of experience and best practices with a view to applying, strengthening, protecting and preserving traditional knowledge, knowledge of indigenous peoples and local knowledge systems, as well as technologies, practices and efforts of local communities and indigenous peoples related to addressing and responding to climate change, taking into account the free, prior and informed consent of the holders of such knowledge, innovations and practices.
